□ Ride Directions

- 0.0□ Ride begins and ends at the Brownsville Pioneer Park. In addition to parking, there are bathroom and picnic facilities available. The park has limited camping and a covered pavilion for group use. □
 - Exit to left on Fischer.
- 0.1□ Bear right on Walnut
- 0.2□ Left on Ash
- 0.3□ Left on Seven Mile Ln. (sign says Depot).
 - Look for red tail hawks and American eagles.
- 2.1□ Intersection of Forry Rd.
- 8.0□ Continue straight onto Linn West Rd.
 - Seven Mile Lane makes a sharp curve to the right.
 - At this point you are looking straight ahead at the steepest climb along this route.
- 9.5□ Morse Bros Quarry
- 10.2□ Right on Roberts Rd. Very flat scenic road virtually without traffic.
- 13.2□ Right on Boston Mill Rd.
- 13.3□ Left into Mill entrance. Historic site and Linn County Park. Great place to spend a few hours. Have lunch.
 - Take a tour. You can always follow this route back to Brownsville but if you would like to continue the loop,
 - exit the parking area and
 - Go Left on Boston Mill Rd.
- 14.5□ Left on Saddle Butte Rd. Linn County Gun Club is on the right.
- 15.0□ Right on Morgan Rd. If you are interested in hooking up with Albany or Lebanon bike trails, continue straight on Saddle Butte until you intersect Seven Mile Lane. However, you will have a lot more fun if you head back to Brownsville.
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- 16.2□ Left on Seven Mile Lane.
- 16.5□ Right on Morgan Rd. A short section of this road is graded but unpaved.
- 17.7□ Right on Manning Rd. This road which has a small incline passes through one of the largest grass seed farms in the area.
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- 19.3□ Right on Harrison. Pour on the speed as you fly down this straight flat section.
- 21.0□ Continue straight as road becomes Seven Mile Lane.
- 21.5□ Bear Left on Seven Mile Lane at this intersection with Linn West Rd.
- 27.4□ Intersection of Forry Rd
- 29.2□ Right on Ash.
- 29.3□ Left on Walnut
- 29.4□ Pioneer Park
